Built in 1954 without a library, teachers have been creative over the years in trying to bring books into their classrooms. This year, in partnership with area families and businesses and through unification into a larger district, the school is determined to make a library a reality for students. The architectural and building plans are moving forward with Twin Rivers USD and State support, but the library still needs books! In spite of the incredibly challenging State budget for schools this year, Friday’s event and the weekend’s fundraiser will help bring the much-needed resources to the school to put books in the hands of the Garden Valley students.
