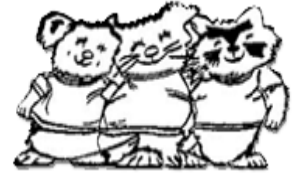

School Safety

Safety of students and staff is a primary concern of Dry Creek School. The school is always in compliance with all laws, rules and regulations pertaining to hazardous materials and state earthquake standards. To ensure school safety, all visitors are to report to the office. District employees and personnel wear ID badges, and staff is on duty before and after school. Each classroom and office area has an Emergency Preparedness Guide. There is a crisis response team in place, and the emergency plan is periodically reviewed and updated as needed. Monthly fire drills are held as well as intruder and duck and cover drills. The school safety plan is reviewed with staff annually.
